



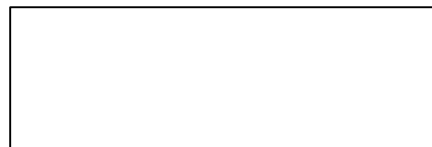

St. David's United Church of Christ strives to be a loving and caring family of God by:

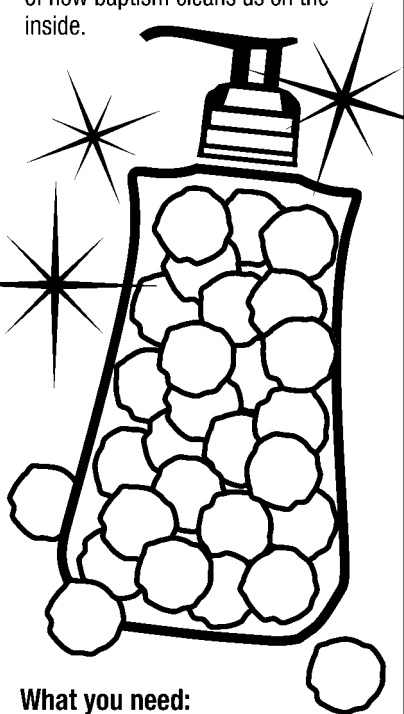

Qualities of an Outstanding Spouse

Love never gives up, never loses faith, is always hopeful, and endures through every circumstance. 1 Corinthians 13:7 NLT

The qualities of an outstanding spouse include a diverse variety of characteristics. First and foremost, a spouse should be a good listener. Good listening skills are an essential foundation for effective communication. It also makes your spouse feel important when you take the time to really listen to what *they* have to say.

Attentiveness is another important factor in becoming an outstanding spouse. It makes your partner feel special, important, valued, and loved. The “little things” are more meaningful than things done on a larger scale. For instance, small things like washing a car for each other can mean more than a large thing like buying each other a car. Of course, in a perfect world, both would be nice! Another outstanding quality of a spouse is a sense of humor. Being able to laugh together and have fun together brings a special bond and closeness to the relationship. Laughing in the midst of difficult or trying situations relieves stress and pressure on both partners.

Being willing to compromise on everyday occurrences, as well as important decisions, goes a long way in learning and growing in a relationship. Growth is essential. If both partners are not growing together in the relationship, the relationship will not flourish, and eventually they will grow apart. Outstanding partners are secure enough in their love to allow the other partner to be themselves, to grow, and spread their wings. They build each other up, not tear each other down. They encourage and support the individuality of the other. Spiritual commitment is a necessary aspect in maintaining a long and healthy relationship. Sharing and growing in faith creates a bond that cannot easily be broken if the commitment is real. Partners unequally yoked will struggle.

Do not be yoked together with unbelievers. For what do righteousness and wickedness have in common? Or what fellowship can light have with darkness? 2 Corinthians 6:14

Respect is pertinent between spouses. One spouse should never talk down to or belittle the other in front of others or in private. Opinions can be voiced and solutions found in a healthy and respectful manner.

An outstanding spouse has a calm demeanor even when the partner is acting like a fool. The fool will soon figure out what an idiot they are and make the necessary apologies.
