

"Pilate said to them, 'Then what shall I do with Jesus who is called the Messiah?' All of them said, 'Let him be crucified!'" Matthew 27:22

Meet Barabbas, although it is not certain that was his actual name. He was a notorious criminal and had been sentenced to die by crucifixion. Suddenly, his fate changed. It was a custom at the Passover feast to release a prisoner of the people's choice, and they, influenced by the religious leaders, chose Barabbas over Jesus. Jesus: kind, miracle worker, lover of those who are poor and children, humble forgiving, had hurt no one. But the crowd chose Barabbas, a known criminal, to be released, and Jesus was handed over to be crucified.

What do you suppose was going on in the mind of Barabbas, now a free man, while the innocent Jesus hung in his place on the cross? What did he do with his life from that point?

As we begin the season of Lent may God help us to remember that in one very important way we are much like Barabbas. We have been given freedom from our sins because Jesus went to the cross in our place. Perhaps all we can say is thank you, Lord. But, perhaps we can use this season to contemplate more, what can we do with our life from this point forward? May our spiritual disciplines of Lent truly have an impact upon us and help to continue to shape us as we remember the sacrifice of Jesus made for each of us.

#### Peace

"Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid. John 14:27

Peace is important. In the King James Version of the Bible, peace is mentioned 429 times in 400 verses.

It's important to keep our peace, but life is rough. There are so many things that steal our

peace and joy. Young children die of cancer. Young mothers die of cancer. Young husband's die of cancer. Life is rough. Even the little things can steal our peace. Someone criticizes everything we do. Dumb drivers cut us off in traffic. They take our parking space. They ride our bumper. So many opportunities in this life to lose our peace.

But yet Jesus says, "I give you my peace. My peace I give to you. Not as the world gives." If we are looking for peace, we are not going to find it in the world. There are wars going on. Political unrest and controversy. Even within churches there's conflict. There's strife in our homes. There's no safe place to go to find peace. We must find it from within and in that secret place between only us and God.

He who dwells in the secret place of the Most High shall **abide** under the shadow of the Almighty. Psalm 91:1

For in the time of trouble, He shall hide me in His **pavilion**; in the **secret** place of His tabernacle, He shall hide me; He shall set me high upon a **rock**. Psalm 27:5

Psalm 91 is such a soothing Psalm of protection. But it also talks about the secret place with God. Abiding with God. Sometimes, that secret place and abiding with Him, is the only place we are going to find our peace. When you find yourself losing your peace more often that nought, it's time to ABIDE in that secret place where we find our rest with God.

Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke and learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. Matthew 11:28

Oh, how peaceful does that sound? He will give us rest for our souls when we come to Him. But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control; against such things there is no law. Galatians 5:22-23

Peace is a Fruit of the Spirit and therefore it is

Peace is a Fruit of the Spirit and therefore it is one of God's attributes. Yes, in the Old Testament, God got angry with the people. But then Jesus came to save. Jesus bore the wrath of God for our sins.

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. Matthew 5:9

Peacemakers who sow in peace reap a harvest of righteousness. James 3:18

Jesus was a peace maker. There's a difference between a peacemaker and a peacekeeper. The peacekeeper wants no conflict, and that is good in most circumstances, but not all. There are times when we must confront the situation to make peace. We can't let someone bully us. We can't let a conflict go unresolved and stay quiet about it when it's tearing us up inside. But we can peacefully find a solution or compromise. We must make the attempt to make peace. As much as it depends on us, try to keep the peace with everyone.

If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone. Romans 12:18

No, there is no safe place in this world to find peace. But we can find it internally, and to do that we must stay connected to the Vine. We must find that secret place where only you and God can meet. A quiet place. A quiet moment. Breathe in the peace of God. Talk to Him. Surrender your cares. Give Him your burdens. It's part of the journey of learning to ABIDE. I am the vine, you are the branches; he who ABIDES in Me and I in him, bears much fruit, for apart from Me, you can do nothing. John 15:5

Yes, peace is a fruit of the Spirit. If we ABIDE in Him, we will bear much fruit. But apart from the Vine, we will lose our connection, and it will be impossible to keep our peace.

You keep him in perfect peace whose mind is stayed on you, because he trusts in you. Isaiah 26:3

Life is rough. People will hurt us. We lose our loved ones. We are used and abused. The world around us is in chaos.

The best thing to do when worldly distractions take over and internal conflict and anxiety prevail is to find that quiet place with God. Be still with Him. Listen for His Voice, His still, small whisper. Pray, read Scripture, listen to worship music. Whatever it is that centers you on God and settles you internally.

And after the earthquake, came a fire, but the LORD was not in the fire. And after the fire came a gentle whisper. 1 Kings 19:12

God is peace. It's one of His attributes. He wants us to have that peace. Jesus came to give us His peace.

The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly. John 10:10

Jesus came to give us an abundant life and peace is part of that abundance. Take that free gift of peace that has been offered to you. ABIDE with Him on a daily basis, and you will find that peace even in the midst of turmoil. That is the peace that passes all understanding, and it can only be found in abiding with God.

Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:6-7 I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world. John 16:33

Now may the Lord of peace himself give you peace at all times in every way. The Lord be with you all. 2 Thessalonians 3:16

And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. Colossians 3:15

They must turn from evil and do good; they must seek peace and pursue it. 1 Peter 3:11

Deceit is in the hearts of those who plot evil, but those who promote peace have joy. Proverbs 12:20

Make every effort to live in peace with everyone and to be holy; without holiness no one will see the Lord. Hebrews 12:14

When the LORD take's pleasure in anyone's way, he causes their enemies to make peace with them. Proverbs 16:7

Let us therefore make every effort to do what leads to peace and to mutual edification.

Romans 14:19

In peace I will lie down and sleep, for you alone, LORD, make me dwell in safety. Psalm 4:8 The LORD gives strength to his people; the LORD blesses his people with peace. Psalm 29:11

# St. David's U.C.C. Consistory Minutes for February 10, 2025

Present at the meeting: Pastor Scott Sager, Sue Brumgard, Chris Darrow, Jenn Fisher, Wayne Fuhrman, Brent Grove, Lucy Halter, Steve Harmon, Pam Hartman, Nicholas Hawkins, Diane Henry, Barb Horneff, Linda Miller, Sue Myers, Shirlee Tasto, and Jim Wissler. Quorum present.

At 7:00 pm, President Lucy Halter called the meeting to order and led with an opening prayer. Sue Brumgard made a motion to approve the Minutes of January 13, 2025 with a second from Chris Darrow. All approved.

Pastor Scott gave a verbal report for his ministry in January 2025.

## **Treasurer's Report**

Harley Hartman submitted/explained the monthly treasurer's report in advance. Steve Harmon made a motion to approve the report with a second from Linda Miller. All approved.

## **Committee Reports:** Finance (Wayne Fuhrman)

Met January 22, 2025 with investment representative Jonathan Maula, Wealth Manager with Castle Hill Capital. In attendance: Harley Hartman, Laurel Fuhrman, Wayne Fuhrman, Ginny Clousher, Dwight Myers, and Pastor Scott Sager.

- Reviewed our Charles Schwab portfolio which has earned 5.52% over 3 years.
   Balance as of 12/31/24 was
   \$1,613,751.55. Based on current interest rates, Mr. Maula's strategy is to continue to invest in shorter term bonds and CDs since they are paying the best rates.
- Anticipated funds for Parking Lot— \$287,150—will be taken from the M&T money market (\$100,000) and withdrawn from the Charles Schwab money market account (\$187,000) to cover the project.
- Reviewed finances as of December 31, 2024 with income and expenses, including current expense trend.
- Reviewed investments/funds—Interest rates and maturities for February and March CDs for \$25,000 each will be held /combined into one CD for \$100,000 to take advantage of the higher interest rate tier. Harley will review current rates in February for available options.
- Annual Audit—Consistory selected two representatives to complete the 2024 audit.

Remaining meetings for 2025—April 13, July 13, and October 12 following the first church service.


