BACK ON SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 7th!**



In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters. Genesis 1:1-2

It's 7:40 a.m. I'm sitting at the pond at the Steamboat Inn in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. I am sitting alone on a small Adirondack chair. The perfect size for me. Only, I'm not alone. The ducks are with me. Some sitting on the bank. Some in the water. Some in flight, gliding in for a graceful landing, making ripples in the pond.

And God said, "Let the water teem with living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the expanse of the sky." Dear Pastor Scott: Thank you for being a friend of Hoffman Homes for Youth! We greatly appreciate your willingness to be a helping hand. Your donation on behalf of various members of your congregation helps our children thrive and truly make a difference in their lives. Let me share a child’s story with you.

“Jessie resided at Hoffman Homes for almost a year. She was diagnosed with PTSD and had a history of severe

physical and sexual abuse. Jessie came to HHY with nowhere to go upon completing her treatment and was initially overcome with frustration towards being “stuck” in a residential treatment program. She struggled to create and maintain healthy relationships, as well as, work towards treatment goals. After being introduced to a family who was sincerely interested in welcoming Jessie into their home, Jessie became more engaged and involved in her treatment. She participated in family sessions and visits with the potential adoptive family. The effort and kindness that this family had given in supporting Jessie throughout her treatment was a key turning point for Jessie. Jessie made significant progress showing exponential growth, not only in her behaviors but by being a role model for peers in her residence. Jessie was able to leave HHY to live with her adoptive family. To witness Jessie create healthy relationships and be united with a loving, supporting family was truly touching. Jessie continues to excel and work towards future goals, while

still having the support of her adoptive family each step of the way.”

LETTER FROM NEW HOPE MINISTRIES

Please read the following letter that gives you a glimpse of how NEW HOPE MINISTRIES is making differences in individual’s lives:

To: St. David’s United Church of Christ

“Dear Friends, Do you know what it’s like to run into roadblocks in life?

Alexi did. When he first came to New Hope Ministries, he needed help with food and with paying his rent. He was having a hard time making ends meet even though he was working a full-time job in a local retail store.

He knew he needed to take a different route in life so he wouldn’t have to keep coming back for help. That’s why one day Alexi asked us about our Commercial Driver’s License (CDL) Class A Program, just one of the many job training programs we offer at New Hope for people who want to find more stability in their lives by being trained in a high-demand and high-wage field. Alexi was driven to end the cycle of financial uncertainty in his life, and he felt that getting training to earn his CDL would be the best way to solve his problem. So, we got to work with Alexi! He attended our Dollars and Sense budget class and Soft Skills class, and we helped him apply and enroll in truck driving school. But before he could start school, he faced another barrier: a reliable vehicle to get to and from classes. Because of generous people in our community, New Hope has a vehicle donation program specifically to help guests like Alexi. And it turned out we had a car available just for him. Alexi was accepted into the driving school, faithfully attended classes, completed the program with flying colors, and passed his CDL driving test. And wouldn’t you know it, as soon as he got his CDL, he was hired by a trucking company and on the road! After completing 40,000 miles of driving, he was given his own truck and route.

Isaiah 41:10 reminds us, “So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.” People like Alexi, facing bumps in the road and feeling dismayed, come to New Hope for help. People like you repave the way so the road is a little smoother. Your financial gifts truly do save lives.
