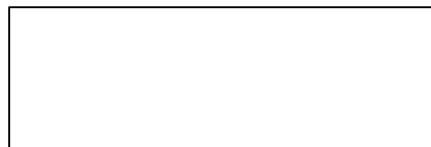

ROBERT KELLENBERGER

Friend of Athletics Inductee



Robert "Kelly" Kellenberger was born in 1925 and passed away at eighty-eight years of age in 2014. Although he never played a sport, or even went to Spring Grove schools, he was a fixture in Spring Grove sports to probably thousands of coaches and athletes over a forty-five year span.

Kelly started driving the late bus for the kids involved in after-school activities and taking athletic teams to their away games in 1960. He continued taking teams to away games until 2005, when he retired at the age of 80. During this time, he also took care of finding bus drivers to fill in as needed when a problem arose in the schedule. There is no way to put a number on all the trips he took supporting the Spring Grove athletic teams in all those years.

He also had another job involving the Spring Grove football teams. He was on the chain gang crew at all the home football games. He would make sure the chains and down markers were at the field, were in working order, and put them away when the game was over. He retired from the chain gang in 2005, giving him at least thirty-five years on the crew.

Kelly loved being around the kids. He always had a smile on his face or was telling a joke or a story to anyone around him. He was a true fan of Spring Grove athletics.

“MOVING MOUNTAINS”

Matthew 17:14-20 “Truly I tell you, if you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, “Move from here to there”, and it will move; and nothing will be impossible for you.”

When I moved from the city back to my small hometown and to the little church where I had grown up, I assumed that the church was too small to be of much significance. Surely, I thought, its light could not shine as bright as that of the large urban church I had attended in the city. My assumptions were wrong.

Almost immediately, I learned that what the church lacked in numbers and resources was offset by the dedication of its members as they filled hundreds of buckets with cleaning supplies for flood victims and went out into the community to repair and maintain homes for residents. This little church moves mountains for the communities it helps and for the members who come together to serve.

People in Jesus’ time thought of him in much the same way I once thought about my church. Most didn’t think Jesus, born to poor parents from a small town, was the Messiah. He worked as a carpenter. He spent time with fishermen. How could a common man make any mark whatsoever on the world, much less be a savior and redeemer?

When we question the significance of our service, we can remember that the first disciples of Jesus were only 12 people. Though small in number, they revealed God’s greatness to an entire world – and so can we.

Prayer: Dear Father, no matter how small or insignificant we might feel, grant us the faith to serve others. Amen.

Operation Christmas Child – Shoebox Items

A “Wow” toy, a doll, soccer ball with pump, stuffed animal. Appropriate for age level; 2-4 yrs old, 5-9 yrs old, 10-14 yrs old.

Hygiene: Bar of soap, washcloth, toothbrush, comb, brush.

Do not send toothpaste. No liquids. Put soap in a baggie.

School Supplies: pencils, pencil sharpener, pen, markers, crayons, notebooks, coloring books, solar calculator, ruler, paper.

Clothing: T-shirt or cap, no writing or pictures on them.

Hair bands, barrettes, sunglasses.

Fill the box with: cars, musical instruments, puzzles, jump ropes, balls, stuffed animals, yo-yos, small Etch a Sketch, slinky, flashlight with extra batteries.

Personal Note: You may include a photo of your family.

Send a note (it will be translated for them) if you like, include your address, they may be able to write to you.

Do not include: used/damaged items, war-related items such as guns, knives, military figures. No food or candy, no liquids or lotions, no medications or vitamins, nothing breakable. No glass containers, snow globes or aerosol cans. No games with English instructions.

Attach the boy/girl labels, marking them to indicate the age group and BOY or GIRL.

Include envelope on top of gifts with \$9.00 shipping.

Place a rubber band around the shoe box and lid.
